ADELAIDE High School students can't help but feel excited that their combined literary talent has culminated in a book called #Radelaide: Stories from Adelaide High.

For the past two terms, the Year 9 English class has been writing under the guidance of author Angela Kingston as part of an writer-in-residence program to write short stories for publication.

English teacher Lee Irvine

said this has been a rare opportunity for the students to develop their creative writing skills with a published author who has a PhD in literature and a teaching qualification.

"The end goal was that their work would be at a publishable standard and that their peers and parents were going to see their work, and this was very motivational," she said.

Year 9 student Zack Taylor, 14, who opted to write a mys-
